

























# Small Business Survey Characteristics

1997 1991

Retail/services 30% 30%

Professional Services 18% 7%

Accommodation/catering 14% 29%

- 60% of businesses linked to tourism
- 56% had most customers outside area (<80km)</li>
- 1 in 5 businesses have moved in to the area.
- 67% in an association ie 33% weren't



## Small Business Survey Employment Stats

- Average 5 full time 3 part time employees
- 93% up to 10 full time employees
- Businesses up to 20 employees had a total of 300 full time jobs and 310 part time
- Businesses over 20 employees had a total of 250 full time jobs and 55 part time



## Small Business Survey Technology Use (1997)

Computer take up only 75%

Large businesses 99%

average business 90%

- High degree of consumer business therefore less supplier pull (eg EDI)
- Poor utilisation of the installed technology eg PCs used as word processors
- 80% mobile phones didn't work in area



## Summary of points General issues

- Rural areas dominated by SMEs
- Small local markets though also serve larger ones (where they compete)
- Limited participation in networks
- Infrastructure poor
- Shortage of skilled staff



## Summary of points Technology Use

- Rural areas dominated by SMEs
- SMEs tend to be behind with ICT (Don't have expertise/funds/culture)
- Rural SME customers don't drive ICT
- Infrastructure can be a barrier








# Telework and Rural Areas (State of the Countryside 2020)

- "..23% of Britons could telework..." (now 7.5 %)
- "Traffic congestion will encourage A third of London commuters have considered moving .. because of poor public transport.."
- "Open-plan offices will require professionals to find uninterrupted periods for reading, writing and reflection."
- "Broadband will improve the quality of communications between teleworkers and their colleagues."






# Telework and Rural Areas (State of the Countryside 2020)

- 'In future, neighbours working from home may become valuable contacts, which would strengthen local communities.."
- "Teleworking could boost the local economy. The more days commuters spend at home, the more they spend locally on kitting out an office, lunches in the nearby pub visiting local shops, rather than near the office. The arrival of professional commuters may attract jobs suited to their skills into the area..."





# Forward View Report (Stepping Stones Report 2003)

- Self employment is a significant feature 11% in rural areas with 8.5%
- Incomers increase rural enterprise, up to 2/3rds of new firms people moving from urban to rural areas attracted by the quality of rural life
- They bring an average of nearly three jobs per migrant. Incomers often bring with them different skills and contacts with distant markets.
