# Key elements of social capital supported by ICTs

- Individual's networks grow
- Shared values & understandings = > cooperative and collective behaviour
  - Communities of interest/trust
- Open up tight social groups
  - democratising?
  - Open to innovations = > economic growth?
  - Bridging (horizontal) & Linking (vertical)
  - Instability & threats?
- Create new networks

# Why is there support for *rural* ICT?

- There is a belief that ICTs can lead to a "death of distance"
- ICTs (& being connected) => democratic processes for people on the periphery
- Because ICTs can lead to more, and different, people becoming active in their own futures
- Because people build their own skills social & technical

Stimulating broadband across the whole of the UK, especially in rural areas, is one of the Government's top priorities. In the past year there has been enormous progress towards providing access to broadband to every community in England. Despite this, Defra recognise that there is still more to do to make broadband available in all parts of the country.

To ensure that the rural dimensions of broadband access are addressed, a dedicated Rural Broadband Team was set up in May 2003 within the DTI. It includes a team of four including a secondee from Defra. The team will focus on the problems and issues relevant to rural areas and will work closely with both ICT and rural specialists in RDAs and local authorities to identify best practice and value for money.



The Rural Broadband Team have recently produced a broadband toolkit to help rural communities and businesses understand the issues surrounding access to broadband.





### Local Places

South Lanarkshire is located in the Central Belt of Scotland and straddles the upper reaches of the River Clyde, extending into the Southern Uplands.

### Local Editors

- 9 pubs, wired up through satellite Broadband links
- 3 high-spec PCs, printers, scanners, digital cameras
- Training offered 12 hours/month
- Broadband access & computers = free for 12 months









## Buckfastleigh Broadband Community Network








### Key points:

- •NO 'exit strategy' from the beginning
- •Narrow decision-making body & inflexible knowledge 'loop'
- Narrow 'ownership'
- •Training on offer for those using Centre; not wider


