


Understanding the communities' green priorities and finding common paths









WIĄZOWNA:

- Natural resources (parks, rivers) for a sustainable & ecological tourism
 - ✓ Proximity to Warsaw
 - ✓ Possibility to engage youths













STARACHOWICE:

- Quality of life, public transport
 - ✓ CUS is very active
 - ✓ Need to activate vulnerable groups, also with educational programmes













GÓRNO:

 Renewable energy (solar plants); quality of the environment (local cleaning actions) linked to tourism



✓ Possibility to engage youths









ELBLĄG:

• Protection of local natural resources from increasing urbanization

✓ Need to activate vulnerable groups (esp. elderly) sensitive to high costs of energy, also with educational programmes

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


Key environmental topics from Italy

COSENZA, Via Panebianco Neighbourhood:

- Creating green zones for the inhabitants, for recreation and aggregation
- Attention to waste management
 - ✓ Transformation of irregular waste collection areas > educational programmes
 - ✓ Transformative power of art through events.
 - ✓ Building neighbourhood identity to strengthen social cohesion
 - ✓ Possibility to engage youths
 - ✓ Lack of trust in (local and national) institutions











Key environmental topics from Greece

KARDITSA:

- Natural resources: landscape, lake, rich biodiversity
- Attention to waste management and circular initiatives (for agriculture)



- ✓ Experiential educational programmes for adults and youths
- ✓ Possibility to engage women (local empowerment initiatives) and workers (local trade unions)
- ✓ Support from ANKA, the local development agency











Key environmental topics from Croatia

PGŽ:

- Focus on renewable energy sources
- Feasibility of Energy Collectives/communities
- implementation of smart villages and inhabited areas (countering the digital divide urban/rural, young/elderly, gender biases)
 - ✓ Possibility to set up a common platform for all activists and citizens
 - ✓ Experiential educational programmes for adults and youths
 - ✓ Existing networks between schools and NGOs
 - ✓ Lack of trust in (local and national) institutions









What events are we going to organise to address these topics?



- Focus groups, interactive workshops, round tables, etc >> reaching a consensus on the key local green issues... as many meetings as needed!
- Local interested subjects > representatives of NGOs, public authorities, schools, training agencies, parishes, youth centres, trade unions...
 - 45 people from Poland, 45 from Italy, 20 from Croatia and 20 from Greece = Total: 130
 - From February to mid-May 2023







How are we going to address these topics?

- Discussion about the priority areas from the padlets
- Collaborative work on the CO-GREEN SURVEY
 - Respondents' experiences in successful participatory processes/practices in local communities
 - Respondents' experiences in debates about green issues
 - Discussion of enabling factors and constraints in the implementation of participatory & green processes and how to improve them > in the CO-GREEN perspective for taking further action
 - Proposals for a framework for local action on one or more green topics







How are we going to keep track of the local participatory processes?

- Proposed toolset
 - Evidence about engaged participants > needed to ensure financial support
 - Evidence about contents, proposals, inputs for further consideration





Next steps

- Event 3: COMMUNITIES GET READY FOR LOCAL GREEN ACTIONS > Transnational research webinar > June 2023
 - Discussion of the frameworks for local action
 - Definition of commonalities and possible synergies across communities
 - Identification of the local trainers: representatives of project partners or other local entities > 8 trainers in Poland, 8 in Italy, 5 in Croatia and 5 in Greece = 26 trainers
 - Launch of the «Call for CO-GREEN trainers» to be trained about methods & techniques for community action (awareness raising, participation and communication) > training to be implemented in October-November 2023 (Events 7 and 8)

 Event 4: ONGOING PARTICIPATORY MAPPING OF THE GREEN PLAYERS

Local participatory events

June 2023 until the end of the project

N. OF PARTICIPANTS: In total, 526 stakeholders and experts will participate:

Workshops: At least, 30 participants per territory will be involved. Total: 270 participants.

Stakeholders' mapping: It is expected that in each territory stakeholders will be identified and contacted:

- In Poland: approx. 80 players, engaged in 4 territories
- In Italy: approx. 80 players, engaged in 3 territories
- In Croatia: approx. 35 players, engaged in 1 territory
- In Greece: approx. 35 players, engaged in 1 territory

Total: 230 participants.

Involved trainers: 8 trainers in Poland, 8 in Italy, 5 in Croatia and 5 in Greece. Total: 26 trainers.





Next steps

Event 5: STRENGTHENING THE CONNECTION

Activation of local groups of stakeholders to develop viable «green ideas» to be implemented in the involved communities	from June to September 2023
Drafting of input papers, or policy papers + the Scenario interviews = document presenting the local visions of the "green futures"	October 2023
Local workshops to present the «green future» and engage other citizens in the discussion and review	November 2023



N. OF PARTICIPANTS: In total, 305 stakeholders and experts will participate:

Workshops to carry out the focus groups: At least, 15 participants per territory will be involved. Total: 135 participants. Group scenario interviews: 2-3 participants per Country will be involved. Total: 10 participants.

2 Local workshops in each Country: 20 participants per workshop - so, 40 participants per Country. Total: 160 participants
